THEATRE PREVIEW

Thomas and lves: It's All in the Words, W-o-r-d-s, Words. at the Burton Taylor from 23rd November

If you have an ear for the nuances and rich textures of language, then this 'double bill' of plays is for you! The Burton Taylor Theatre are bringing to life Dylan Thomas's Under Milk Wood and David Ives's much neglected All in the Timing. Those who think of Thomas as primarily a drunkard and secondly a poet will be proved mistaken. Whilst glimpses of a drunkard's perspective decorate the opening scenes of UMW, this is only a glaze to his luxurious palette. The dream scene adds a surreal depth to the make-believe Welsh village of Llareggub (buggerall); not least because it ambles through the reflective memories of drowned and sleeping souls.

Through this dream-confusion of character identities (the actors play about five each), the homogenous nature of village life is revealed. Once you get used to the variations on the Welsh accent, the characters merge and emerge through their differing experiences. Interstices of humour, irony and pathos, revealed in rich rounds of descriptive or spoken language, breathe life into this jumbled community. The second scene brings a 'morning' air of uneasy remembrance, as the drunk confronts the inconclusive pointlessness of his night's unbridled activities. Women gossip and the village resumes a normalcy that is nevertheless overshadowed by drifts of life-death imagery. It is far from sombre, though; There's the woman who complains of her nightly 'school-girl beating, or the revelation of the drunkard's pathetic pranks. But comedy mostly seeps in through the words; the ironic, accepting chuckle of a weary, inebriated man who finds beauty in pathos. UMW is succeeded by a collection of four (of five) short sketches by American author/playwright, David Ives. This continues the 'language' theme, pointedly entitled All in the Timing. These pieces are witty, and short to be appreciated without boredom; anyone familiar with modernist works like weeney Agonistes (1932) will recognise the genre of conscious word patterning uces 'content' to a minimum, whilst giving words centre-stage as sound-combina ut dull it is NOT! e, for a start, gives no opportunity to twiddle one's thumbs. FILM REVIEW

Fight Club at ABC George Street this week

This latest offering from the director of *Seven* is a good try, but somehow it never quite gets there. During a gruelling two and a quarter hour cinema session, this tale of millenium angst has Ed Norton and Brad Pitt grappling with life, desire and each other in an attempt to escape the consumerist mundanity of mail-order furniture, condo living and mobile phones.


The anonymous narrator, played by Ed Norton, is an insomniac living a humdrum but materially comfortable life as an accidentcalculator for a car firm. When his doctor advises him to go see some real suffering, in the form of a testicular cancer support group,

he becomes addicted, and finds comfort amongst the terminally-ill, in particular between the expansive breasts of hormonal Bob, played by an equally expansive Meatloaf. Unfortunately, the remedial effects of the groups are interrupted by another disease junkie (Helena Bonham Carter). You may ask what all this has to do with fights, or Brad Pitt, or anything. Nothing really, other than to introduce Helena as the rather tenuous, if sexually athletic, 'love' interest, and to provide a darkly humourous interlude (albeit very sick) that is probably the most entertaining in the film.

Anyway, enter Tyler (yes, that's Brad), as the sinister yet beguiling badboy in a tight t-shirt, who lures the narrator into his dark world in true doppelganger tradition. Spurting philosophical prognostications such as 'Our great war is a spiritual war, our depression is our lives' he is, unfortunately, irrepressibly boring, and manages only to sound like a teenager with attitude. Tyler persuades his new-found friend to join his campaign to destroy the blasé world around them by, among other things, recycling the cellulite of rich women extracted during liposuction, inserting pornographic frames into Walt Disney cartoons, redesigning airplane emergency advice and, yes, creating Fight Clubs, where men can relocate their masculinity by beating each other to a pulp.

The fault of this film is that it can't decide whether it wants to be a typically gory, musclebound action movie or a philosophical and psychological debate about the nature of self and self-delusion. Both could work, but the mixture left me unsatisfied on both accounts.

> The disturbed nature of all the main characters is so complex that it requires further development to make us appreciate their condition. Meanwhile we are fed a story of an underground Fight Club that, again, is not fully developed. Although Fight Club, and fascism of Tyler, neither tie up properly within the greater scale of the plot The result? A meaningless mish-mash of pretentious pseudo-philosophy and gratuitous gore. Fight Club had me fidgeting in my seat, not from the sight of Brad Pitt's six-pack, but from indescribable boredom.

OPERA REVIEW

Glyndebourne Touring Opera Pelleas et Melisande

Apollo Theatre Griday 12th November

n brief, this was probably one of the best operas I have ever seen. The extraordinary design and painstaking direction intensified the fantasy of Debussy's only opera, producing, not only a work of art, but the most surreal theatrical experience this side of the Theatre de Complicite.

Pelleas et Melisande is not the most straightforward of stories to start with: each scene appears almost entirely disconnected from the others, like a series of dreams all involving the same characters. The story is like a bizarre combination of *The Magic Flute* and *Tristan und Isolde:* the prince Golaud finds a mysterious girl crying by a fountain in a forest and marries her without being able to discover anything about her beyond her name, Melisande. He takes her back to the castle of his mother and grandfather, where she appears to fall in love with his half-brother Pelleas. The rest of the story, one that ends fatally for most of the participants, is devoted to their affair and Golaud's jealousy, but it is told with extraordinary subtlety and beauty, through a series of strange and unresolved little scenes.

The set, first of all, is incredible. The floor of the stage is a sea of red and yellow flowers beneath a perspex covering, creating the illusion that the singers are moving around on the surface of a fairytale lake of drowned roses. On top of this the designer Paul Brown has set up the rugs and furnishings of a 1900 drawing room, with a few strange distortions that you might find in a dream - a china vase is 10 feet tall, the lamp hanging from the ceiling is large enough for Melisande to sit in. The players, triumphantly bucking the tradition of opera-singers as overweight marionettes, create impressions of bedrooms, gardens and caves out of chairs and thin air. The characterisation of the performers was also impressive, especially the terrifying childlike passivity of Mary-Louise Aitken's Melisande.

All of which is combined with Debussy's music and the sort of voices and orchestra one would expect from GTO. This is a performance of extraordinary imagination, which, unlike most imaginitive performances, respects and elevates the original work rather than twisting it into an unnatural form. 100 years after the premiere, you can't
